SPEED CAMERA CRUSADERS

Conduct Recommendation Guide

Dear Supporter,

Thank you for your ongoing support of the 'Speed Camera Crusaders' movement. Together we can make change, the SCC team are pleased to hear that you have ordered one or more signs from us, we have prepared these guidelines for you so that you are aware of how to keep any protests you partake in safe and legal.

1. General Conduct

- a. To ensure that your protest remains both a safe and legal exercise of your rights it is <u>EXTREMELY IMPORTANT</u> that you do not physically stop the camera from taking a photograph of <u>ANY</u> offending motorist, or block it in any way. It is equally important that you do not obstruct the speed camera operator or any member of the Western Australia Emergency Services whilst they are performing their duties.
- b. Do not approach an operator unless they make it clear they would like to have a conversation with you. **DO NOT** act in an abusive way towards any operator or member of the public.
- c. It is not uncommon for police/council attention to arise from your presence, this is nothing more than intimidation; the good news is, if this happens you are making an impact! Record **ALL NEGATIVE ENCOUNTERS** and submit them to SCC for review and free advice.
- d. Maintain a distance of at least 100 meters (200 meters is recommended) from the Speed Camera to ensure that motorists are not targeted before seeing your sign.
- e. If you are issued with a move-on-order from a member of the WA Police Force, it is advisable to leave the area, and stay away until that move on order is no longer valid, **NO CITIZEN** other than a sworn in police officer can force you to move locations, this includes speed camera operators.
- f. Stand away from the road in a safe and legal position, out of the way of all pedestrians, traffic, cyclists and other vehicles.
- g. It is advisable to record all negative encounters with members of the public, whilst this is rare, it does happen.
- h. Only protest in a place that it is safe to do so, if conditions become questionable, vacate the area and find another camera.
- i. Do not park your car in the emergency lane, on a footpath, council verge, private property or otherwise area with restrictions related to stopping, standing or parking.
- j. By protesting with an SCC sign you indemnify the page administrators and associates of any responsibility of any consequences arising directly from your protest. It is always **YOUR RESPONSIBILITY** to ensure your protest is safe and legal.
